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Sliding Fee Scale

Individuals and families with income at or below 100% of the federal poverty guidelines and do not have access to Region funding assistance or probation vouchers qualify for services at no cost.

The sliding fee scale is available for individuals and families that are above 100% and at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines and do not have access to Region funding assistance or probation vouchers.
